Brand New Annual Art Event Will Draw Tourists and Locals to Artist Studios All Over the Island of Maui Year After Year

In February 2011, a brand new event will be launched on Maui. It is the first of its kind in the state of Hawaii. Artists and artisans who work in any medium in the visuals arts are welcome, including but not limited to, fashion designers, film makers, painters, photographers, tattoo artists, wood carvers, jewelry designers, graphic designers, textile designers, ceramic artists, illustrators, sculptors, body painters, digital artists, metal artists, print makers and more. We want as many visuals artists working in a diverse range of mediums to participate in the event. The public will have a wide range of selections to choose from as they customize their studio tours.
